

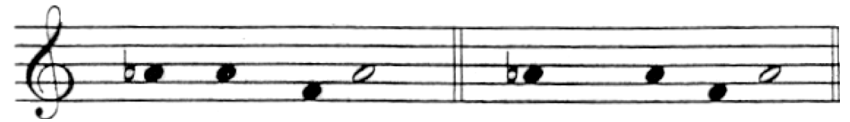
## THE EVE OF THE RESURRECTION

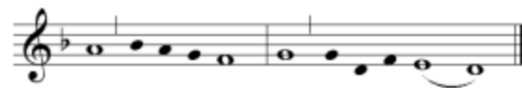
